 - *Naviance* resources include *Career and Personality Assessments* and a variety of *College Research* components

- Transcripts, teacher recommendations, and school profile are uploaded and sent through *Naviance*
 - All requests are made through *Naviance*. Use of *Naviance* is required (instructions to follow)
 - *Naviance* is *separate* process from your application



Factors in College Admission

Rigor of High School Coursework (Scheduling)

Academic Performance - High School GPA (unweighted/weighted)

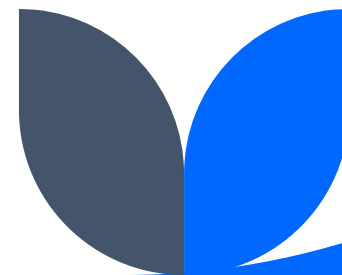
Standardized Tests: SAT and/or ACT Scores (Test Optional-Florida publics require)

Extracurricular Activities (depth) – “Standout factor”

Community Service/Volunteer Work

Personal Statement - Main Essay and Supplements

Letters of Recommendation typically required by private colleges and some public (Teacher and Counselor) – Not Florida!



The Middle 50% - What it is and What it is Not

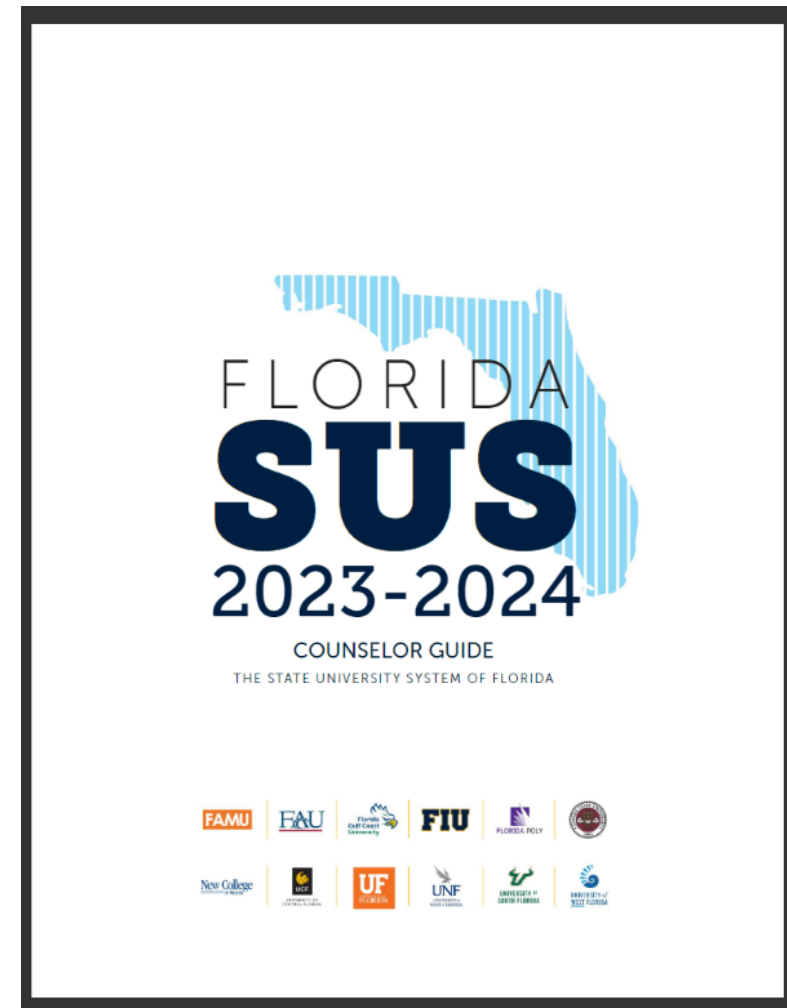
Middle 50% for GPA and Testing
