College Research -Guiding Principles

- Know thyself
- The goal should be "best fit," not "best name"
- Be careful to not overvalue or undervalue a college
- Program, Place, People, Price, Priorities! Research
- Best "fit" analysis must take Net Price into account
- Have "frank family discussions" about funding before selecting schools - "Hope is not a plan"
- Create a diversified, well balanced college list (Reach, Target, Likely)
- Use trusted resources to make well-informed, timely decisions (PVSCollegeCounseling.com and Naviance)
- Your list is your list. Do not listen to the "noise"
- Act with integrity








Florida Public Universities







Pay close



You are strongly encouraged to apply to two or more Florida public universities (NOT just UF!)

Refer to the SUS **Matrix** and specific admissions information

attention to SUS timelines and requirements as changes may occur between now and Fall 2024



Common App and Self-reported Academic Record (SSAR)

Costs & Financial Aid at State Public Universities

- Considerably lower costs v. out of state public/private universities
- Bright Futures Top Scholars Award covers 100% of tuition. Lower-level
 Medallion Award covers 75% of tuition at in-state universities
- Most State Universities offer merit-based scholarships in addition to Bright Futures (and Honors colleges/opportuntities)
- In-state publics accept *all* Dual Enrollment and Advanced Placement credit up to 45 credit hours (1.5 years)
- Opportunities to double major or minor
- Lowered undergraduate costs in light of long trajectories (graduate and medical schools)

The Common Application

The 2024-25 *Common Application* will 'refresh' and be available starting in early August 2024 (the application for fall 2025). You may set up an account earlier. You should review the application NOW and start planning your responses which you may simply transcribe in late summer!

Begin writing your essay. You should have a strong draft by August 1st - See College Essay handout

Research the supplements for each of the colleges to which you are applying (and plan/write). These usually remain the same from year to year

Institutional Applications (Public, In-State) - Several in-state public colleges also use their own "institutional" application. These typically open earlier in the summer and are easier to complete (USF, USF, FIU and others) - You may decide to apply through these and not the *Common App*
