School Description

Pine View School for the Gifted was founded in 1969 by the Sarasota County School District to meet the unique needs of intellectually gifted students in grades 2-12. As the only school of its kind in Florida—and one of the few stand alone gifted programs in the nation—Pine View offers an exceptional educational experience that fosters intellectual curiosity, academic excellence, and personal growth.

Pine View provides a dynamic and enriching learning environment where intellectual inquiry is celebrated, and a culture of achievement is nurtured. The school has a rich tradition of rigorous academics and has consistently ranked among the top public high schools in the state and nation. Beyond academics, Pine View offers extensive opportunities for creativity, leadership, and innovation, ensuring that students are well-prepared for both higher education and future careers.

At Pine View, education extends beyond the classroom. Character development and service learning are integral to the student experience, encouraging social awareness and a deep sense of responsibility. Through meaningful projects and initiatives, students are empowered to make a lasting impact on their communities and beyond—an enduring tradition that defines Pine View's legacy of excellence.

Enrollment

Admission to Pine View is based on a comprehensive evaluation of students' intellectual abilities, including full-scale intellectual assessments, performance scales, academic achievement and recommendations. The school serves 1,770 students in grades 2-12, with a high school enrollment of 709 students (Grades 9-12) for the 2024-2025 school year. The Class of 2025 comprises 161 students.

GPA/Class Rank

It is Pine View School policy not to report class rank.

All high school courses (Grades 8-12) are used in computing Grade Point Average. It is important to note that electives taken by many Pine View students for intellectual diversity and challenge are *not* weighted, so that even high grades in these courses may lower a student's weighted grade point average. 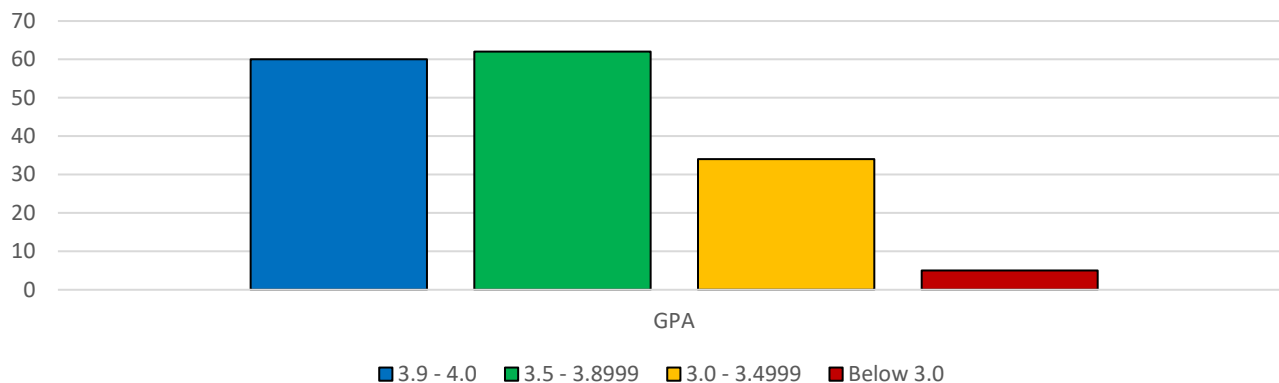

At the high school level Pine View offers 100 weighted courses, including 8 Dual Enrollment, 35 Advanced Placement, and 57 Honors courses. To earn a Pine View Diploma, students must complete 26 credits, including 17 core academic courses taught at Pine View by gifted-endorsed faculty.
